Vocab	Definition
<b>Second Conditional</b>	A structure used to talk about imaginary or hypothetical situations in the present or future. It is formed using 'if' and the simple past tense, followed by 'would' and the base form of a verb.
<b>If Clause</b>	The part of a conditional sentence that expresses a condition, often using the word 'if'.
<b>Main Clause</b>	The part of a conditional sentence that expresses the result or consequence based on the condition in the if clause.
<b>Would</b>	'Would' is an auxiliary verb used in second conditional sentences to indicate a possible result or consequence.
<b>Hypothetical</b>	Imagined rather than actual; used for describing hypothetical, unreal, or imaginary situations.

# Contextual Usage
