Syllable	A unit of pronunciation having one vowel sound, with or without surrounding consonants, forming the whole or a part of a word.
Accent	The prominence or emphasis given to a syllable or word in speech.

Contextual Usage

- **Rhyme:** In the poem, the words 'cat' and 'hat' **rhyme** with each other.
- **Word Family:** The words 'act', 'react', and 'interaction' belong to the same **word family** based on the root word 'act'.
- **Phonemic Awareness:** Children with strong **phonemic awareness** are able to recognize and manipulate sounds in spoken language.
- **Syllable:** The word 'elephant' has three **syllables** - el-e-phant.
- **Accent:** The **accent** falls on the second **syllable** in the word 'banana'.
